# **Report from Councillor Lawrence Fitzpatrick**

Attended: Holocaust Memorial Day - Theme 'For A Better Future' Shakespeare for Schools – The James Young High School/Inveralmond and Bathgate Academy pupils re-enacted 3 Acts from Macbeth – incredible Meeting Twinning Partnership – Hochsauerlandkreis

Met Cabinet Secretary for Education at St Kentigern's Academy. WLC have spent £35m on reconstruction due to RAAC... seeking £15m from Scottish Government.

Met with Eddie Kenna, new Scottish Fire & Rescue Service Commander for West Lothian/Falkirk

Friday 7<sup>th</sup> March @ 10am Civic Centre Livingston – Day of Reflection/brief service, large public attendance at special commissioned art remembrance sculpt.

Lanthorn Centre – celebrating opening event Sunday 23 March 2025

Community Centres – Council clearly confirmed none will close and will continue to work with Management Committees to agree operational solutions. WLC cannot continue with arrangements where Management Committees retain all income – Council pays for heat/light/staff/repairs.

### <u>BUDGET</u>

Council rents will increase by  $3^{1/2}$ % - approximately at £89 pw Council Tax to increase by 8.95%, roughly averaging the norm in Scotland Between 2007/08 – 2024/25 Scottish Councils allocate share of Westminster block grant fell by one quarter, which when aligned to 10 years Council Tax freezes has required £179 million in cuts. Immense pressure on social care/education/homelessness National 20mph speed limit strategy in Appropriate Urban Areas, implementation in West Lothian will follow Transport Scotland's Guide.

### **EDUCATION**

Our Primary Schools continue to excel. Improvements in our County's quintile for numeracy & literacy attainment are well above national levels. Validated Self-Evaluation continues to prove its worth, done on 3-year cycle

### **NURSERIES**

Education Executive on 4 March agreed to closure of 8 nurseries with exception of Glenvue.

#### **ENVIRONMENT**

Blue Tongue disease which affects hoofed animals increasing Dog walkers be careful to avoid droppings. It is not zoonotic Council closed all schools and public buildings on 25 January – red alert status Our operational staff worked to clear over 600 trees country wide throughout Saturday and Sunday. Heart-breaking to see so many beautiful trees uprooted – root bases weakened by such heavy rain over many months.

West Lothian Local Development Plan (LDP2) – out for consultation
